President Annual Report – Mario Ruel, President 2019-2020

This is my second President Report to be presented at the Canadian Geotechnical Society (CGS) Annual Board of Directors Meeting, during a Teams virtual meeting on September 11, 2020, (*Note: the traditional in-person BOD meeting could not be held due to the pandemic situation*).

1.0 General Update

Over the past year we have rapidly progressed on all on our initial objectives while responsibly managing the CGS business and always keeping in mind the four pillars of our administration founded on encouraging our young members, welcoming more women in geotechnique and increasing the services to practitioners and francophones. In addition to our aggressive goals we successfully faced the challenges related to two major transitions, i.e starting up our new CGS magazine, Canadian Geotechique/Géotechnique canadienne, and our working agreement with Karma Link, which also involves managing our new National Office.

But we also accomplished all this while going through the extraordinary challenging times of the current pandemic situation. It is our profession to adapt to unpredictable changing conditions imposed by Mother Nature. So, I am proud with the way we have all responded to these adverse circumstances with innovative ideas and resiliency through our National Office, Divisions, Committees and Sections across Canada. An excellent example of our capacity to adapt is the bold decision taken at the onset of the Covid-19 situation by the Calgary LOC and supported by our CGS Executive Committee to organize the GeoVirtual 2020 Conference. Thanks to the vision and outstanding efforts of co-Chairs Justyna Kos-Fairless and Daniel Bertrand, this smart risk is paying off with what promises to be a successful event which will bring over 400 participants together for the 73rd consecutive year.

Despite the uncertainties, our membership remains strong and the CGS continues to provide increasing level of services to our members. Finances are well managed with a positive balance thanks to relatively steady revenues and controlled expenses.

The CGS is solid and in good financial health. Through this adversity we are becoming even stronger together.

Below is a brief overview of some of the activities since my last report in September 2019; additional details are given in three Vice-Presidents' reports and in the CGS Annual Report.

Our focus was on the new Online CFEM, and new ways of communicating with our youth and all our members with outreach to the wider geotechnical community.

2.0 Technical

CFEM/MCIF - Online Manual

I am glad to report that we are still on track with our most challenging commitment. Thanks to the persistent efforts of the Project Coordinator **Ken Skaftfeld**, working with our VP technical **Rob Kenyon**, the Canadian Foundation Engineering Manual (CFEM) is under active production with the first draft being near completion.

Merci, thanks again to the chapter leads and authors for participating at this National undertaking. We are proud of our CFEM and eager to work with the new online version.

Cross Canada Lecture Tours

Rob Kenyon advanced the planning the next four Cross Canada Lecture Tour with the selected speakers until fall 2021 but all CCLT presentations were suspended with the advent of the COVID 19 pandemic.

Colloquium Lecture Series

The 2019-2020 Colloquium Lecture Series has been very successful with over 10 presentations in several cities and online by Kathy Kalenchuk, our CGS Colloquium speaker at GeoSt.John's 2019. The Geotechnical Research Board selected Ariane Locat as the 2020 Colloquium speaker, which will be presented during the GeoVirtual 2020 Conference.

Canadian Geotechnical Journal (CGJ)

The high quality CGJ still continues to be an outstanding publication making us very proud. It is also an excellent technical resource for the CGS members and an efficient mode of communication on geoscientific developments in Canada and worldwide. The CGS still attracts a high level of interests from the scientific community with over 843 articles submitted last year (19% accepted). Merci to Craig Lake who is about to complete his mandate as Co-Editor, at the end of this year, and to Greg Siemens who will continue as Editor along with Daichao Sheng.

CGS E-News and Canadian Geotechnique

As mentioned in my introduction; 2020 saw the successful transition from Geotechnical News to the CGS magazine Canadian Geotechnique published by Karma-Link (Lisa Reny, Managing Editor), in collaboration with Nicholas Beier (Editor of CGS News) and other members of the Editorial Board. This sharp looking publication is of high quality and interest, thanks our CGS members who are writing articles with rich content. It will be important to keep inviting and motivating CGS members from Divisions, Committees and Sections to share scientific development and r best practices and to give us a sense of what is occurring from coast to coast.

Divisions and Committees

Most Technical Divisions and Committees have remained active over the last year as indicated in the reports submitted by the I 7 Divisions and 8 Committees. I'd like to mention the Heritage Committee who has been working with ASCE, on the GeoStrata magazine, the EIC, and also organized special historical sessions at GeoVirtual 2020 and in past conferences

3.0 Financial

Despite the fact that our finances could not escape some negative consequences from the pandemic shutdown, the impact to date is under control and should not be as severe as some anticipated. Expenses were somewhat reduced and overall revenues remained healthy despite a decline from an understandable attrition of membership and sponsorship revenue. This reduction, however, was partly compensated by a welcomed revenue following the CGS participation in the organization of ASCE GeoCongress 2020 last winter.

The VP Finance report, produced by **Kent Bannister**, indicates that the CGS remains in a healthy financial position even the year end projections are below budget. Even with determined efforts it was more difficult to stay on the 2020 initial predictions, especially considering this exceptional period. Thanks to the leadership of our VP Finance Kent Bannister and the executive committee.

4.0 Communication and Member Services

VP **Judith Bouchard** maintained her dynamic pace with a series of creative initiatives to provide better member services in 2020.

Along with **David Wood**, our new Chair of the Membership Committee in 2020, she continued her leadership role to implement suggestions from the Membership Task Force and to enhance member's experience. As a follow up to address membership issues she acted proactively on the conclusions of the brain storming workshop held last fall in GeoSt.John's by Judith, **Maraika DeGroot** and **Andrea Lougheed**. Some of the best ideas were implemented such as, for instance, the Membership automatic Annual Renewal Option to simplify this yearly administrative process for our members.

As a result of several initiatives significant improvement of CGS communication and outreach were achieved 2020; for instance: revamping of Enews; 2020 communication campaign; focus on social media; CGS Website enhancements; successful webinar trials; introduction our new Canadian Geotechnique magazine and finally emails from the President to all participants from local sections across Canada as another mean to reach not only all our CGS members but also the wider geotechnical community,

The CGS continued it's mission to invite our youth and also encourage, support and engage women in the geotechnical field with initiatives like the "Women's Networking Breakfast" at the GeoStJohn's 2019 Conference and also with a special panel session "Women in Geotechnique" during GeoVirtual 2020.

5.0 Sections

As indicated in the report from our Section representative **Billy Singh** most CGS Sections across the country remained active and adapted to Covid, with an average of 5 events for the 2019/2020 period. The CGS promoted webcasting and knowledge-sharing and encouraged extended use of web-casted events. The webcast / webinar sessions had the positive effect of increasing interactions between Sections.

It is interesting to note that there are over 2,625 geoprofessionals who participate in local section events. I want to thank the 161 volunteers leading these local sections, serving all our members and reaching out to our geotechnical community with over 1,600 non-CGS members. The sections represent the CGS all across Canada and has the potential to encourage more participants at the local level to join and become members the CGS National. 6.0 Young Professionals

Welcoming our youth is the first of our four pillars guiding our actions. The cYGEGC 2019 was successfully organized by our current Young Professional Rep on the EC, **Vincent Castonguay**, in St-John's with a two day technical program and with an important brain storm session in which several innovative ideas were proposed for future developments within the CGS.

The first Early Achievement Award was presented for the first time in 2019 to **Suzanne Powell**, and this year the award will be revealed during the Geovirtual 2020 Award ceremonies.

Thank you to Vincent for having successfully followed up on the one-year pilot project (initiated by the previous Rep. Maraika DeGroot) to establish newCGS Student Chapters in Canadian universities.

7.0 Relations with Affiliated Organizations

As president of the CGS I am a strong advocate of developing and maintaining collaborative ties with other organizations to reach a wider part of the geotechnical community

In Canada, we have continued to develop closer ties with the CSCE by participating in biannual meetings and joint technical meetings at local levels. Collaboration with CSCE has always been beneficial as we have mutual interests, but this year is special as we have even more in common since **Catherine Mulligan** (CGS member and chair of Sustainable Geotechnique Committee) is now the President of CSCE. The CGS also promoted joint meetings and alliances with several other Canadian organizations such as the Canadian Dam Association, the Canadian Federation of Earth Science, and the Tunneling Association of Canada

The CGS stays a strong and active participant at the (EIC) Engineering Institute of Canada's meetings and events. The EIC provides some of the most respected engineering awards in Canada. The CGS was very well represented again this year with four recognitions by the EIC: **James Graham** was awarded the Julian C. Smith Medal for his achievement in the development of Canada; **Doug VanDine** was awarded the John B. Stirling Medal for leadership and distinguished service at the national level; and two other members were made Fellows of the Institute: **Harry Oussoren** and **Garry Stevenson**.

US & International; We pursued more ties south of the border. For instance, just before the Covid shut down, we collaborated with ASCE GeoInstitute for the organization of the successful GeoCongress2020 in Minneapolis. We also continued to work with the GeoCoalition and with some of its member organizations such as the DFI (Deep Foundation Institute) and the GBA (GeoProfessional Business Association).

We also maintain connections internationally with, for example, the ISSMGE through our North American VP **Tim Newson** (CGS member) and with the IAEG's VP North America **Jean Hutchinson** (CGS member).

I believe in mutual collaboration and sharing experience as well as leveraging our influence to better promote our profession and be even more relevant in our world.

8.0 Administrative

As mentioned in the introduction, the transition to a new management team with Karma-Link was smooth and successful thanks to the well organized and hard work of the CGS Executive Director **Michel Aubertin** and Director of Communication and Society Operations, **Lisa Reny**. The National Office has moved in a new location last fall, following the contractual agreement.

Ian Moore will take over the affairs of the CGS as he will become President of the Society at the end of this year for the period 2021-2022. The future of the CGS will be in good hands under his leadership.

The CGS strength is due to the extensive volunteering work by our members serving as Section Directors and Chairs, Division Chairs, Committee Chairs and Chair of the Geotechnical Research Board, with their respective executives and participating members.

Vice-President Technical Annual Report – Rob Kenyon

1.0 General update (with action items from last meeting)

This is my final annual report since taking over the position of VP Technical. At this time I would like to thank our President, fellow members of the EC and well as the BOD for their excellent contributions to the Society and to the upcoming CFEM 2021. Much of my time and energy has been spent on the next edition of CFEM, as well as the regular duties of CCLT, Conference Planning, Committees, Awards, Nominations etc. I must thank Ken Skaftfeld for coming on board as Coordinator of CFEM 2021 to assist and drive the next addition of the Foundation Engineering Manual. A special thank you is due the LOC of the Calgary Conference for all their planning and effort in switching to GeoVirtual Calgary 2020.

2.0 Cross Canada Lecture Tours (2020, 2021,2022)

The scheduled speakers for the Cross Canada Lecture tours were organized to be:

Spring 2020 Dr. Ellen Rathje (Texas A&M University)
Fall 2020 Doug Stead (Simon Frazer University)
Spring 2021 Steve Kramer (Washington State)
Fall 2021 Jocelyn Hailey (University of Calgary)

All CCLT presentations were suspended with the advent of the COVID 19 pandemic and remain on hold pending developments with respect to the pandemic.

3.0 CFEM/MCIF – Online Manual

I am very pleased to report that significant progress has been achieved in the development of CFEM 2021 since my 2019 annual report. Regular monthly meetings to track progress and resolve production issues have been held during 2019/2020 with bi-weekly meetings occurring in June and July, 2020. Most importantly, we remain on track and are heading to production and publishing in 2021.

- Overall production of Draft Chapters is 75% complete where 90% is considered a complete first Draft in our hands.
- Nine (9) Draft Chapters out of twenty-three (23) primary chapters are in hand and heading to external review.

- Nine (9) Chapter Leads are reporting more than 50% completed with most of those authors projecting a completion date of September/October, 2020.
- Five (5) Chapter Leads are reporting 50% or less. Each has been contacted directly and we are assured that we will receive all of these chapters by November, 2020.
- A summary table "CFEM Summary Progress August 25, 2020" is attached as Appendix A.
- A Senior Advisory Committee (SAC) is established and has been providing valuable advice and guidance to the Coordinator and Chapter Leads. A list of Senior Advisory Committee members is attached as Appendix B.
- The Senior Advisory Committee has also supplied an extensive list of External Reviewers for each chapter. Each Draft Chapter will be reviewed by two independent external reviewers.
- A small working group (RK/KB,MA, MR, LR) have held discussions with Canadian Science Publishing (CSP) regarding production and marketing of the Manual. Expect a Motion to the annual EC meeting and the annual BOD meeting this September to approve the selection of CSP as the publisher responsible for final production. My thanks to everyone involved with this exercise.
- The intent remains to have a preliminary version of the CFEM 2021 available in late 2021. That date may slip into the first quarter of 2022 depending on final submission dates of a few chapters.
- In the meantime, we do have enough printed copies of CFEM 4, English version only.
- Ken Skaftfeld, current CFEM coordinator and Rob Kenyon have volunteered to take on Co-Editorship of the publishing of CFEM 2021 once our current mandate expires this January, 2021.

4.0 Colloquium Lecture Series

The Colloquium Lecture Series is strong and active and has been show casing young emerging talent within CGS for decades. The 2019 Colloquium speaker at GeoSt.John's was Dr. Kathy Kalenchuk. The 2020 Colloquium speaker will be Dr. Ariane Locat, as selected by the Geotechnical Research Board.

So far, Dr. Kalenchuk has presented the Colloquium 10 times in person, 2 times on-line, with one additional on-line presentation planned. Presentations so far have included: Ottawa, Edmonton, Calgary, Saskatoon, Victoria, Vancouver (at UBC and local CGS), Quebec City, Halifax, Kelowna. A Winnipeg stop has been indefinitely postponed due to Covid-19 and another date has been set for Sudbury in September.

5.0 Canadian Geotechnical Journal (CGJ)

The CGJ continues to excel with a total of approximately 853 manuscripts having being received in 2019 (888 were received in 2018). The acceptance rate in 2019 was 19% (21% in 2018) based on the numbers published. In terms of the quality of the Journal, the Thomas Rueters' Impact Factor rose to 2.8 (Ranked 13/39 in Engineering, Geological, and 68/200 in Geosciences, Multidisciplinary). The Elsevier's 2019 SJR (Scimago Journal Rank), also a measure of influence and prestige, rose from 1.813 to 1.934 (Ranked 10/263 in Geotech Engineering and Engineering Geology).

Thank you to Craig Like, Greg Siemens, and Daichao Sheng. Co-Editors, as well as the Associate Editors and the Paper Reviewers for an outstanding job. The CGJ continues to be an internationally recognized journal and an excellent resource for our members. A special thank you to Craig Lake who retired as Co-Editor at the end of this year.

6.0 CGS E-News and Canadian Geotechnique

Major changes came to the CGS in 2020 in the form of a monthly, on-line E-News letter and in the revamped CGS News, now renamed Canadian Geotechnique. Monthly production of the CGS E-News is under the

direction of Emily Fournier. Canadian Geotechnique has been launched on-line to members under the Editorship of Nicholas Beier (publishing by Karma-Link Lisa (McJunkin) Reny and Emily Fournier). Canadian Geotechnique continues to be published four times per year (March, June, September, December) with mandatory items as per the CGS Manual. Many thanks to all those CGS members who provide article to these efforts.

7.0 Links and Joint Activities

Links and joint activities are generally reported in individual detail as part of Committee and Division Reports. Both Committees and Divisions remain very active with other National and International organizations: A brief summary looks like:

- Cold Regions is affiliated with CPA (Lucas Arenson, President), and CNC-IPA (Ed Hoeve, Exec. Committee), ASCE Cold Regions Division (Heather Brooks), and the IPA (Lukas Arenson, Richard Fortier).
- Engineering Geology is affiliated with the Association of Geohazard Professionals (AGP), the CFES (Nicholas Vlachopoulos), IAEG, and AEG Engineering Geology Division. Jean Hutchinson is VP International for IAEG.
- Groundwater Division maintains a strong relationship with AIH-CNC, organizing joint conferences and awards.
- Geosynthetics is affiliated with IGS NA and with IGS (CGS has a non-voting position on the IGS NA Board).
- Soil Mechanics is affiliated with ISSMGE.
- Rock Mechanics is affiliated with CARMA (Sam Proskin, Past President), ISRM, and ARMA.
- Transportation Committee is affiliated with TAC (Roger Skirrow), the ongoing Rail Ground Hazard Research Project (Numerous), AEG (Mario Ruel), ISSMGE TC 202 Transportation (Mario Ruel), as well as the TRB, GeoRail, and the UK Institute Permanent Way.
- Geohazards Committee collaborates with CGS Geology and Transportation committees, as well as the US AEG (Schuster Medal), and Joint IAEG Commission C 37 Landslides Nomenclature (Scott McDougall, Dave Cruden).
- Heritage is interacting with our Education Committee and with ASCE GeoStrata.
- Education Committee has been working with Young Professionals to establish student chapters across Canada. That effort has been very successful, with 7 excellent student chapters established and 2 additional chapters having applied for 2020/2021.

8.0 Committees

All seven standing committees remain very active this past year. Summary reports are available elsewhere but I continue to be impressed by the level of effort and initiative that I see within each of the committees.

9.0 Conferences

9.1 CGS Annual Conferences

St John's 2019: The GeoSt.John's 2019 conference was very successful technically and financially, A final conference report has been submitted to CGS National.

GeoCalgary 2020: Planning for GeoCalgary 2020 switched to organizing a virtual conference for 2020 (GeoVirtual2020.ca) due to the Covid 19 pandemic. The LOC is to be commended for all of the hard work

and effort to switch from one conference venue to another in such a short time period. A revised MOU has been submitted to both parties for review and signature.

Conference 2021 (SOS – Niagara Falls): A conference MOU has been finalized for what is still planned to be a traditional format conference. The conference organizing committee will update CGS at the GeoVirual 2020 conference.

Conference 2022: Calgary has requested, and CGS National has agreed, that Calgary will host a traditional conference, GeoCalgary 2022, given that most practical aspects of the 2020 conference were in place including deposits on numerous conference facilities, and giving Calgary an opportunity to showcase its city in a traditional format.

Conference 2023. Saskatoon organizing committee members have agreed to host the CGS Conference in 2023, a delay of one year versus this annual report of last year.

Conference 2024. Montreal has submitted a strong proposal to host the 2024 CGS annual conference.

9.2 Other Conferences

Cold Regions 2019, Quebec City was a very successful specialty conference. A conference report has been submitted by Jean Cote.

ASCE GeoCongress, GI, 2020 (Minnesota) – was very successful with CGS being a co-sponsor. The Canadian contribution consisted of several specialty sessions and a number of papers.

ISSMGE 2021. Planning is well underway with Canada having submitted 33 papers. Many thanks to Andrea Lougheed for organizing our Canadian papers and authors.

GeoHazards 8, Quebec City in 2022 planning is underway with an MOU in place.

RockEng20, a symposium organized at Queen's University, has been postponed for one year due to Covid 19. A revised MOU between CARMA, Queens, and CGS is in progress.

10. CGS Involvement in ISSMGE Committees

Tim Newson, VP NA will be providing a brief summary on ISSMGE activities in the past year and he will be doing that immediately prior to the CGS BOD meeting. In the meantime, Appendix C of this report lists the CGS members on the numerous technical and other committees of ISSMGE.

Introduction

The following is a statement of the CGS finances for the period January 1 to June 30, 2020. Unless stated otherwise, all figures are in thousands (000s) of dollars. Also, please note Quarter 2 Books have not been fully reconciled but are directionally correct for management purposes.

Summary of Revenue and Expenses to July 31, 2019

Revenues to date are \$276.4K compared to \$283.6K for the same period in 2019. Membership revenue is down \$36.4K compared to 2019, publications income is down \$10.9K, and the collection of sponsorship income is ahead of 2019 for this period by \$3.8K. Conference revenue is ahead by \$20K compared to 2019 due to revenue received from the ASCE GeoCongress held in Minneapolis earlier this year (typically we do not realize conference revenues until later in the year). Other revenues of \$18.4K consist largely of reimbursement by the Canadian Foundation for Geotechnique for colloquium tour and awards costs.

Expenses paid in 2019 are \$188.8K, compared to \$212.6K for the same period in 2019. The difference in expenses is largely due to a reduction in a society operation costs due to the elimination of an in-person EC meeting in the spring due to COVID 19 and the fact that, unfortunately the spring CCLT was cancelled.

Notes to Accompany Summary of Revenues and Expenses

Income

- The reduction in income is largely due to lower rate of membership renewals compared with the same period 2019. This is likely a result of slower renewals due to Covid-19 and the uncertainty with respect to the annual conference (prospective authors typically renew early to ensure they can register for the conference at the member rate). It is anticipated that based on the present financial situation for many businesses that membership revenue will not meet budget targets for this year.
- The loss in membership income is partially offset by higher conference, sponsorship and other income which together, narrows the gap between 2020 and 2019 at this point in time.
- GeoVirtual is targeting a balanced budget which means that the only conference revenue for 2020
 is projected to be from the ASCE GeoCongress held earlier this year along with some revenue still
 expected for a Cold Regions Specialty conference held earlier this year.
- CFEM sales are steady but continue to be lower than the same period last year. Karma-Link has
 adjusted the accounting for CFEM sales which reduces the costs for CGS and improves our overall
 profit margin on sales of the manuals.
- Corporate Sponsors income was slightly higher than in the same period last year, largely due to Canadian Geotechnique advertising incentives available to CGS corporate sponsors. Sponsorship has not been actively pursued this year based on the present financial climate.
- Other income includes:
 - CFG Income of \$18 K is actually their reimbursement for some 2019 expenses (CCLT, CGS awards and Matt Lato's Colloquium Lecture Tour). This was received in 2020.
 - Interest Income of \$ 0.4 K

Expenses

- CCLT expenses were unfortunately not realized this year due to cancellation.
- Lower society operations and conference costs have more than offset the slight decline in income
 for the period. This translates into a 23.4% increase in profit. The lower society operations costs
 are largely associated with reduced expenses due to the cancellation of the in-person spring EC
 meeting.
- New initiatives spending to date includes Kathy Kalenchuk Colloquium expenses (CFG will reimburse), a Gotowebinar subscription, 50% of Constant Contact subscription (shared with Karma-Link), EIC oral history interview and see money for the Dalhousie University Student Chapter.

Section 2: Membership

JB chaired the Membership Committee (MC) as an interim from January 2019 to January 2020. Since July 2019, the Membership and Data report was finalized. This report presents the two-step strategy put forward by the MC to better understand the state and evolution of CGS membership, and to assess CGS members' expectations and preferences. Based on this data, four primary membership issues were identified including a likely decrease in membership in the coming years (the main revenue sources for the CGS). JB wrote an article for the new magazine in March 2020 summarizing this report in collaboration with Vincent Castonguay. A new chair was chosen in January 2020 for the Membership Committee; David Wood.

JB organized a Design thinking workshops on CGS membership issues in GeoStJohn's in collaboration with Maraika DeGroot and Andrea Lougheed. To brainstorm solutions to address the membership issues identified in the Membership and Data report prepared by the MC, design thinking workshops were undertaken with two groups, the CGS Board of Directors (BOD) and the Young Professionals (YPs) at the Canadian Young Geotechnical Engineering and Geoscientists Conference (cYGEGC). Through the design thinking workshops, close to two hundred ideas were brainstormed, covering vast topics. Ideas produced between the two workshops were different. YPs were interested in big topic discussions such as climate changes and educating high school students whereas the BOD was more focused on fees and membership loyalty. The ideas suggested in both workshops were webinars and mentorship. A report was produced.

A proposal on a CGS Membership Automatic Annual Renewal Option was presented to the BOD in GeoStJohn's and approved. The automatic renewal option has been set up on the website and with the bank. It was functional for the 2020 renewal.

The CGS wants to encourage discussion about how to successfully support and engage women in the geotechnical field. A Women's Networking Breakfast was organized by JB during the GeoStJohn's conference. The event was a success and has brought together 30 women from our geotechnical community.

Section 3: Communication

A new Enews format was prepared in collaboration with Emily Fournier. Constant contact was used. The revamp Enews includes more pictures and some new sections (i.e. Geotechnical News from Around the World, news from the section, CGS members in the news etc.) The first revamped Enews was sent early 2020 and has received good feedback from the members. The statistics from the first months were good, with open rates higher than the industry average.

A communication campaign was initiated in March 2020. The 2019 Membership Committee survey highlighted the fact that the CGS needs to better promote its initiatives. Many suggestions given by members in the survey were initiatives that the CGS is already doing. One other point highlighted by the

survey is that our members want to better understand how the CGS works and operates. The communication campaign aims to better inform our members and non-members of our initiatives and on how the CGS works and were shared in the Enews and on social media. The first post was *Did you know the CGS sends up to 20 students or EIT to the Annual conference?* and the second post was *Did you know the CGS has a Young professional program?* The second post was a video that was prepared in GeoStJohn's in August 2019, featuring the past and current young professional representatives. Posts will continue to be prepared every few months.

The CGS social media pages continue to attract member signups and interest. The CGS always welcomes possible content for posting. The number of CGS posts on social media highly increased during the last year, and the number of followers also increased in that period. The number of Linkedin followers is now more than 3 times higher than at the beginning of February 2019. Social media is a great way to reach out to a broader audience, to share CGS initiatives and attract new members.

Section 4: Website

The CGS website is regularly updated and improved in terms of content and functionality. Google analytics was installed on the website to monitor the web traffic, and adjust our communication strategy with time. With this new tool, we found out that our clicks on the items of the Enews have tripled with the new revamped Enews. This tool tells us what pages were visited, where we get our web traffic from: 39 % *Direct* (i.e bookmarks) 10% *Referral* (through a link given on a different platform (i.e enews)), 50% *Organic search* (i.e Google), and 1% *Social*: social media. The web traffic from Social media came from: Linkedin 55%, FB 33%, Twitter 7%, Instagram 5%.

Section 5: Webinars

One of the most frequent comments that were given in the Membership workshop was that CGS members wanted more online resources and webinars. In collaboration with multiple local sections across Canada, the CGS presented a webinar series in May and June 2020. Up to 500 participants registered to the webinars, bringing the Geotechnical community from around the world together in these uncertain times. The feedback from CGS members and local sections was good and many people showed interest in having more of those webinars. The five webinars were:

- May 21 Collaboration with SOS Lessons Learned as A Trenchless Litigation Expert and Designer by Mark Knight, Associate Professor, Department Civil and Environmental Engineering, University of Waterloo
- May 25 Collaboration with Southern Alberta (Calgary) Section Geotechnical Engineering Innovation to Advance CCUS - From Smart Rocks to the Aquistore Project by Richard Chalaturnyk, Professor and NSERC/Energi Simulation Industrial Research Chair in Reservoir Geomechanics at University of Alberta
- June 1 2019 CGS Colloquium Mitigating a fatal flaw in modern geomechanics: understanding uncertainty, applying model calibration, and defying the hubris in numerical modelling by Kathy Kalenchuk, President & Principal Geomechanics Consultant at RockEng.

- June 8– Collaboration with Eastern Quebec (Quebec) Section An Introduction to the Design and Construction of Large Embankment Dams, Marc Smith, WSP Canada Inc.

Section 2: Report on young member events

- 6th Canadian Young Geotechnical Engineers and Geoscientists Conference (cYGEGC): The conference was held September 26th to 28th, 2019, in St. John's Newfoundland, the week prior to GeoSt.John's. 34 delegates attended the conference's one day of technical tour and two days of technical program. The technical tour led the delegates through an inactive iron ore mine as well as to Cape Spear to learn more about the local geology. The technical program included poster presentations and elevator pitches from delegates, plus five keynote speakers who also participated in a panel discussion. The CGS was a gold sponsor for this event, along with providing seed funding.
- GeoSt.John's 2019: A YP and Student Icebreaker was held on Sunday September 29th, 2019, in the
 main conference hall. The event included a panel discussion with geo-professionals from various
 backgrounds and experiences. The event was a success, attracting many young (as well as some older)
 conference delegates.
- GeoVitural 2020: A YP special session is scheduled on Tuesday September 15th, 2020. The event will be held on the online platform Remo.co and should last 1h30. The first part of the event will consist of group discussions (maximum 6 people per group) regarding how covid-19 impacted the field of geotechnical engineering. A panel discussion will follow during which questions coming from the host and from the floor will be asked to a group of three panelists.

Section 3: Websites

The CGS website now includes a dedicated section for students and young professionals (under the "Membership" tab). Information about the various initiatives organized for this specific demographic within CGS can be found in the "Benefits and Sponsorship" and "Award and Competitions" web pages.

Section 4: Finances

No finance is managed by the YP Representative. There is money in a reserved fund under the Education Committee that can be used for Young Professional or Student Initiatives.

Section 5: Affiliations with other organizations

The ISSMGE Young Members Presidential Group started a pilot project in 2019 in which the CGS YP Representative actively participates. The goal of this initiative is to create a platform where young member representatives from various ISSMGE member societies can meet and exchange ideas. Several meetings were initially held with only a few member societies representatives (including CGS). The initiative has now been broadened to a few dozen member societies and constitutes a unique opportunity to discuss with peers from around the world.

Section 6: Young professionals awards

- CGS Early Achievement Award: The first edition of this award was presented during the Awards
 Ceremony at GeoSt.John's 2019. The award is intended to recognize outstanding accomplishments
 provided by members in the early years of their career; it focusses on excellence of technical
 achievements and contributions to the geotechnical profession, service to the CGS, and service to the
 practice/industry. The second edition of this award will be presented at GeoVirtual 2020. For both
 editions of the award, the selection committee was composed of the CGS YP Representative, the CGS
 VP-Technical and the Chair of the GRB.
- ISSMGE Young professionals awards: two young professionals awards will be presented at the next
 International Conference on Soils Mechanics and Geotechnical Engineering (ICSMGE Sydney 2021).
 The CGS arranged a nomination package for the Outstanding Young Geotechnical Engineer Award and
 two nomination packages for the Bright Spark Lecture Award (a new award) to represent Canada.

Section 7: CGS Student Chapters

- The one-year pilot project to establish the CGS Student Chapters ended in May 2020. Seven Student Chapters were created in Canadian universities and local CGS sections over this trial period.
- The CGS YP Representative will submit a report on the pilot test to the CGS EC and the BOD in August 2020. The report will serve as a basis to determine whether or not the initiative is to be continued.
- If the initiative was to be continued, one additional Student Chapter would be created for the 2020-2021 school year (Western University).

Section 8: Additional information or comments

- Vincent Castonguay took over Maraika DeGroot's position as CGS Young Professional Representative on January 1st, 2020, for a two-year mandate.
- The YP Representative coordinated the publication of two news articles in Geotechnical News (December 2019) and Canadian Geotechnique (September 2020) highlighting the St. John's cYGEGC and the first year of CGS Student Chapters.
- The CGS has been granted two young member representative slots to participate in the next International Young Geotechnical Engineers Conference (iYGEC Sydney 2021) held prior to the ICSMGE. The two representatives will be selected by October 2020.



SECTION REPORTS

Sections Representative Annual Report – Billy Singh

Most Sections held on average 5 events for the 2019/2020 period. The majority of events comprised technical lectures, including the Cross-Canada Lecture Tour (CCLT). Some Sections continue to require support from the Section Representative, CGS HQ, and well-established neighbouring Sections. There has been increased interaction between Sections through donating funds to smaller sections or providing webcasting of technical lectures.

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic and associated regulatory restrictions, all sections cancelled in-person events since March 2020 to conform to various Federal, Provincial and Municipal Guidelines. Many sections opted for virtual events which were attended by a significant number of respective local section members as well as others across the country. Initiatives were taken by the national CGS to provide a webbased platform to help facilitate individual sections to arrange and promote these virtual events. These virtual events resulted in a significantly higher level of interaction between different sections, as well as national CGS office.

During this full year (July 2019 to June 2020), 161 members of Section Committee Executives – all volunteers – served their 2,625 Section members, and arranged a total of 94 events (technical and social) achieving over 2,160 in attendance. This does not include the attendance at Geo St. Johns 2019. About 7% of the Section Executive Committee members (11 in total) were students, all serving as student representatives. The CGS continues to serve well the Geotechnical community at a local level and is encouraging involvement of students.

The effectiveness of the efforts of each Section may be compared with the other sections based on the data reported. These comparisons must be interpreted based on the context of individual Section, e.g., some sections report numbers from mailing lists versus paid members. Although further improvement is possible, the statistics reported definitely reflect the hard work evident from the Section reports.

Total section membership reported in the table below is missing four sections, which in the half-year reports accounted for approximately 380 members. Adding these to the membership numbers reported below, overall reported membership increased by 32% (as noted before, this trend may not necessarily represent the National CGS membership trend because many sections report their membership solely based on the mailing list and not paid/registered members. Three Sections were noted to have annual membership fees that vary between \$10 and \$25 for regular members. Other Sections gain revenue through various streams, including running short courses and charging per technical talk.

One measure of delivery to local Section members and of the Section's workload is the ratio of the number of events held annually per member of the Section Executive. The average ratio across the nation is about 0.83 events per Section Executive member with values ranging from 0.08 to 4 for individual sections. The number of events held per member for a section is also a useful indicator averaging at about 0.012 and ranging from 0.00 to 1.33 for various sections. Another such measure is the ratio of the annual attendance at events per member of the Section Executive which averages at about 31.9 and ranges from 0.0 to 104 across various sections, though the above evaluation does not provide a direct measure of the quality of the events held.

A measure of the participation by local Section members is the attendance per member at the events. The average attendance rate is about 2.9 events per member ranging from 0.0 to 14.3 for various sections. The percentage of the membership represented on the Section Executives ranged from about 1.6% to 52.0%, averaging 12.4% for different sections. On average, each member of an Executive served about 17.5 Section members.

It is evident that the Section Executives are contributing significantly and serving as an Executive is likely to be particularly demanding where the work is not evenly shared, particularly for smaller Executive Committees. The activities reported here refer only to events held for members, while the Section Executives also need engage in other planning, logistics and functional activities for a successful operation of an individual section. The data provided by the Sections are summarized in the table below.

The effort by Section Directors across Canada in providing the information summarised in this full-year report is acknowledged with gratitude, and also the excellent work the Sections have done in serving our members.

The annual meeting of the GWD was held during this conference. A new Vice Chair, François Duhaime, was also recruited for the GWD during the GeoSt John's Meeting. François is a professor at École de Technologie Supérieure and a long-lasting collaborator of Robert Chapuis, a retired professor at Montréal Polytechnique who was editing the groundwater section for the Canadian Geotechnics Magazine when published in its old format. François has agreed to continue Robert's work and be the editor of a groundwater section in the new Canadian Geotechnics Magazine.

- It was noted that several major urban public transportation projects are underway across the country and there was a great deal of interest at the last Committee Meeting to organize a speciality session about these projects, possibly at the Niagara Falls CGS Conference. Unfortunately members working on these projects echoed the observation that the owners of these projects were very reluctant to allow the presentation or publication of any information about these projects until well after they have been completed and all possible litigation threats have been resolved. A take away goal from the Committee Meeting was that these individuals would try to convince the respective owners of these public transportation projects to allow purely technical presentations about their projects, avoiding any discussion regarding finances, politics or organizational problems. Planning for this specialty session will begin in 2020, assuming enough permissions are granted by the owners.
- 2018 through to 2020 has proven to be a very difficult time for the Transportation Geotechnique Committee. The agenda for the Committee has in the past been driven by the strong interest and support from members representing the various roadway ministries of the provinces and municipalities, as well railways and pipeline operators. With the ongoing fiscal tightening of budgets associated with these groups, their attendance at the national conference has dwindled and as a consequence, the number of papers with a transportation theme has also decreased. In addition, many of the former leaders who actively promoted the activities of the Committee have been retiring and the connections with the organizations they represented are being lost. Committee members have been requested to reach out to the new people populating these positions and to encourage them to participant or support in some form, the activities of the Transportation Committee.

- Don Lewycky confirmed that he would continue to Chair the Transportation Geotechnique Committee until the end of 2020, when Harpreet Panesar of the Ministry of Highways and Infrastructure for the Province of Saskatchewan will assume the duties of the Chair.
- Ahmed Mahgoub of Wood Engineering has confirmed he will act as the Secretary for the TGC.
- Several CGS TC members are also still taking leadership roles in the Railway Ground Hazards Research Project (RGHRP), which is very active on;
 - Numerous remote sensing, hazard detection and risk management research projects
 - The development of several MSc's and PhD's in the field of transportation geotechnique.
 - The elaboration of technical guidelines for ground hazard management for railways which could eventually be extended for other transportation corridors.
- The TGC was requested by the organizers of GeoCalgary 2020 to review six papers with a transportation theme and to chair sessions at the conference. While we responded positively to the request, the events leading to the postponement of the conference until 2022 apparently resulted in the TGC's assistance no longer being required.
- Starting in early June, the Committee Chair began sending members of the TGC copies of some of the
 transportation related papers presented at GeoStJohns 2019. It was an effort to generate interest in the TGC by
 highlighting the kind of work being done by TGC members and to disseminate these papers to those members
 who were unable to attend the conference.
- All members of the TGC were invited to participate in a free webinar hosted by the Geotechnical Society of Edmonton (GSE) on June 16, 2020. The presentation was entitled Settlement Analysis on Glacio-Lacustrine Clays using Observational Method for a New Interchange in Winnipeg, Manitoba. Presented by Dave Kurz, Ph.D. of the KGS Group, it was the first attempt by the TGC to participate in an electronic webinar. The exact number of TRC participants was not available, but a cursory scan of the names of the participants during the presentation found several TRC members located across the country that did take in the presentation and would not normally be expected to participate in a GSE event.

• At the well attended and lively meeting held in St. John's, an impediment to more active participation by the Committee was identified by several members representing the consulting industry and the universities. As most major transportation projects are undertaken by governmental organizations, there has grown a GREAT reluctance by these bodies (in most cases driven by their legal staff) to allow the publication or presentation of any information on projects that are either ongoing or experiencing problems. Even raw technical data is being withheld from universities who request the information in order to produce their own analyses or in the production of work of a general nature which would be enhanced by the acquisition of more aggregated data.

Section 8: Do you have any specific questions or issues that you would like to bring to the attention of the VP Technical or the CGS National Office?

It was suggested at the last Transportation Geotechnique Committee meeting held at the St. John's conference, that the Committee ask the CGS Executive whether it would be possible to include an option to join the Transportation Geotechnique (or the other Committees) on the annual CGS membership form. If it is deemed that this would make the

membership form too complicated, than a link could possibly be added to the web page so that an individual could join there. In this way, the CGS would be able to maintain better membership lists which could be vetted by comparing Committee members to the CGS membership list. Lists are currently just passed down from one Committee Chair to the next with little opportunity to vet those people who are no longer CGS members, retired or have no future interest in the activities of the Committee.

Canadian Geotechnical Journal, Craig Lake, Editor-in-Chief Annual Report July 1, 2019 to June 30, 2020

Canadian Geotechnical Journal continues to attract a healthy number of manuscripts, with 848 manuscripts received in 2019, down slightly from 883 received in 2018. At the end of 2018, the journal had accumulated a 12 month backlog, which we were determined to reduce to a reasonable level. Such a determination had led to many desktop rejections and perhaps the slightly decreased number of submissions.

The journal's 2 year impact factor increased from 2.45 in 2018 to 2.80 in 2019. Other metrics including the 5 year impact factor rose further this year, in significant part due to excellent service provided by our authors, Associate Editors (AEs), Editorial Board Members, and anonymous reviewers. Many international experts assist with the provision of expert and timely assessments, and we offer our thanks for the continued support of those reviewers. We extend our special appreciation to former AEs David Muir Wood and James Oswell, who stepped down from the Board. We also welcome on board Jianye Ching, Behzad Fatahi, Joana Fonseca, Cristina Tsuha, and Wei Wu as our new AEs in 2020.

Our Editor-in-Chief (EIC) Craig Lake has decided to step down by the end of 2020. Craig has served the journal for 16+ years, first as an AE and then as an EIC, and has made an outstanding contribution to the journal's success, which unfortunately means sacrificing countless hours of his own time. Craig has demonstrated exemplary professionalism in his editorship, and his fellow EICs, AEs, and Editorial Board Members have greatly enjoyed working with him.

Meantime, we welcome our new EIC, Greg Siemens, who has been an AE of the journal since 2009. Greg will be the lead EIC from the beginning of 2021.

Finally, we would like to thank all the staff at Canadian Science Publishing. Editorial Assistant Donna Hartson continues to provide excellent support to board members, authors, and reviewers. Celia Charron and Lesia Beznaczuk support our work through their roles as Managing Editor and Scientific Publishing Editor, respectively. Without this continued support, our role as EICs would be very difficult.

This is my second annual report as the CGS News Editor since taking up the post on January 1, 2019. During my second year, Geotechnical News transitioned to Canadian Geotechnique/Geotechnique Canadienne and with it, the CGS News Section. Expanded citations of the various CGS award winners were included in the issues of the magazine following the CGS annual conference.
