

## STEVEN V. ROSE (1957-2018)



Steven Vincent Rose passed away in Kingston, ON, on June 29, 2018.

Steven was a founding principal of Malroz Engineering Inc. in Kingston in 1989. He was a practicing geoenvironmental engineer and registered as Professional Engineer and Professional Geoscientist in Ontario, as well as a Professional Engineer in Alberta, Nova Scotia, Alaska and California. He was certified as a Diplomate, Water Resources Engineer with the American Academy of Professional Engineers.

Steven's work and volunteering was recognized by his receiving the Professional Engineers Ontario's (PEO's) Order of Honour, the Ontario Society of Professional Engineers' (OSPE's) President's Volunteer Award, and a Fellowship of Engineers Canada.

Steven earned a B.Sc. (Geological Engineering) from Queen's University and a M.Sc. (Civil Engineering) from the University of Southern California. He remained active in academia as an Adjunct Assistant Professor with Queen's University's Department of Geological Sciences and Geological Engineering.

In 2006, Steven served on the inaugural Executive Committee of the Kingston Section of the Canadian Geotechnical Society, and remained on that committee after serving as the Section Director. He was an active member of the OSPE community, as a former member of its Board of Directors and served on numerous committees with OSPE, PEO, and the Ontario Environmental Industry Association (ONEIA).

Steven's career included site investigations and construction activities across four continents. He was recognized as a specialist, or subject matter expert, in numerous aspects of environmental consulting including: site assessments and investigations (environmental site assessments—ESAs), hydrogeology, remediation technologies, and project management and controls. His experience included engineering site investigation, design and construction/remediation, expert testimony on matters relating to hydrogeology and contaminated sites. Steven represented Canada twice as a delegate to NATO's Pilot Study Workshops on Closed Landfills and Urban Brownfields Redevelopment. He also edited a book, published in 2009, titled *The Story of Brownfields and Smart Growth in Kingston Ontario: from contamination to revitalization*.

Steven leaves behind a legacy of professionalism, integrity and kindness that his friends and colleagues will forever cherish.
